#### **Summer Band Survival Items!!!**

Please don't forget the following items for your summer band rehearsals!

- ➤ Instrument & accessories
- ➤ Music (including flip folder)
- ➤ ½ Gallon Red Water Jug (purchased at registration)
- > Light weight and light-colored clothing
- Tennis shoes (absolutely no sandals, flip flops!)
- ➤ Hat, sunglasses, and sunscreen

Because summer band can be an extremely physically demanding event, it is highly recommended that students take the proper precautions to stay healthy. Here are some tips to have a more pleasant experience!

- o **Stay hydrated!** Drink plenty of water and juices. The more that you consume, the less likely you are to suffer heat exhaustion or even heat stroke. Stay away from carbonated beverages!!!
- Eat healthy meals! Stay away from greasy junk food and consume more fruits and vegetables. Also, don't forget to eat a good breakfast. You will be working very hard in the heat, so don't try to run on an empty stomach.
- o **Get plenty of rest!** Although summer band is in the summer, you must get plenty of sleep at night so that you can function properly during morning rehearsals.
- Go outside! Take a walk, exercise, do yardwork, or anything that will get you outside in the sun. It take 7-14 days to become acclimated to the heat.

## Required Physical for Marching Band

All marching band students are required to have a physical examination before participating in marching band rehearsals. The UIL is requiring all students to have one on file with the district before rehearsals begin on July 27 (July 25 for 9<sup>th</sup> graders). All students are expected to bring his/her pre-participation physical examination form signed by a physician, a physician assistant licensed by a state board physician assistant examiner, a registered nurse recognized as an advanced practice nurse by the board of nurse examiners, or a doctor of chiropractic. Examination forms signed by any other health care practitioner will not be accepted. Students who do not do so, will not be allowed to participate in marching band rehearsals. Please fill out the form below and bring it to your scheduled physical examination. Once this has been completed, you can either email it to me or bring it the first day of camp.

Since percussion and color guard camp take place before full summer band rehearsals, color guard and percussion students will need to complete your physical form and bring it with you to the first day of camp, July 17.

Note: If you are in athletics and band, you will NOT need a separate form for each activity. Also, if you received a physical last year, you will not need to complete a physical until next year. (Physicals are required every 2 years.)
